# Grants Updates

**AS OF MAY 2021** 

A host of personal and environmental factors affect young people's learning and earning outcomes. To help vulnerable youth overcome these barriers, they must be addressed holistically, tending to the complex economic, social, and personal factors that affect their trajectories in life.

In addition to strengthening government agencies and mechanisms that serve out-of-school youth in the Philippines at national to local levels, O2 has also ensured that other actors surrounding young Filipinos should likewise be supported. As such, a grants program is incorporated into O2's programming, aiming to enable youth-serving organizations, training services providers, and higher education institutions to serve OSY in communities better.

## September 2020

The **Youth Community Grants** engaging youth-serving organizations in Cotabato, Isabela, and Zamboanga were launched.

- 10 applications received
- 9 applications shortlisted and evaluated
- 6 awards granted
- Php 1.5 million total amount granted
- O2-supported activities will be completed by July 2021

#### **January 2021**

The **Training Development Grants** engaging both ALS and TVET service training providers were launched.

- 34 applications received
- 25 applications shortlisted and evaluated
- 8 grants awarded
- 8 are in the final stages of negotiations

#### **March 2021**

The **Higher Education Institution Grants** engaging colleges, universities, foundations, and other organizations that provider higher education services were launched.

- 41 applications received
- Shortlisting is ongoing and evaluation will run until May 2021.

#### **April 2021**

The second grant call specifically engaging ALS service providers was launched. The deadline to submit applications is on May 27, 2021.

## **Youth Community Grants**

Out-of-School Youth Education and Development in the New Normal Grant

Launched in September 2020, six (6) organizations were awarded grants on January 2021. The Youth Community Grants call aimed to support community-based COVID-19 responses that aimed to restore the OSY's access to learning opportunities. Grantees began activities in January 2021 and are expected to end by July of this year.
