INTRODUCTION



USAID Opportunity 2.0 (O2) is a Php 1.9-billion (\$37.5 million) collaborative program designed to support existing programs and mechanisms for Filipino out-of-school youth (OSY) that seek to improve their education, employment, and livelihood outcomes by 2025.

O2 is implemented by the Education Development Center (EDC) in collaboration with the Department of Education (DepEd), Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), and 15 partner city government, along with other stakeholders.

A grants mechanism is incorporated into O2's programming to strengthen local capacity through youth-serving organizations, training service providers, and higher education institutions to better serve OSYs in communities.

Through this mechanism, USAID has awarded 87 grants worth up to Php 115 million (\$2.02 million) to 67 organizations and institutions across the country since 2020. To date, up to 5000 OSYs across 15 cities have already upskilled through the USAID O2 grants. Millions more will benefit through the grants on research, capacity building for community leaders, and after enhancements are institutionalized within local organizations.

Grants helped local service providers enhance their training programs for youth by adopting new modules on Life Skills, Work Based Learning (WBL), Be Your Own Boss (BYOB), and Higher Education and Training Readiness Orientation (HERO) from EDC.

These content enhancements equip learners with highly sought-after skills in the world of work and business, drastically increasing their chances at success after training.

In addition to curriculum enhancement, being part of the grants program provides organizations with capacity building for their pool of trainers. This levelled-up the competencies of local trainers to delivery quality training using positive youth development approaches, youth-centered techniques, and flexible methods of instruction.

Services that aim to uplift marginalized groups rely heavily on the local capacity of youth-serving organizations, training service providers, and higher education institutions that directly deliver programs to the OSYs.

With local actors capacitated, interventions for the youth will be innovative, cross-sectoral, responsive, evidence-based, and context-specific. Initiatives will be effective and create sustainable pathways for OSYs to find post training success such as new jobs, own business start-up, or further studies.

This is exactly what USAID grantees have achieved as part of the O2 program. We developed this compendium to showcase the achievements of USAID partner organizations. We hope you find inspiration, a new partnership, or a valuable insight from the incredible pool of knowledge and experience from this group of youth champions.



It brought significant positive changes to the lives of 90 OSYs, offering them hope and support. This program serves as a prime example of finding a silver lining in difficult circumstances

PTI will continue to participate actively in the Cebu City Youth Development Commission and provide services to OSYs through its core programs including case management support and building youth readiness for further education, employment, and self-employment for them to thrive in freedom and dignity.

QCU offers bachelor's degree programs for Entrepreneurship, Industrial Engineering, Electronics Engineering, Information Technology, Accountancy, Management Accounting, and Early Childhood Education.

Grant Objectives: To deliver a a six-month executive course designed for 160 barangay officials, youth leaders, and community organizers including OSYs ALS and TESDA course completers to better understand the situation of OSY in the community, and train them to develop and design community programs, projects, and activities that will address the situations, problems and concerns of OSY.

Grant Highlight: QCU was able to gather 160 barangay officials, youth leaders, community organizers, and the OSYs in one setting to plan, design, and develop relevant, sustainable, and cross-sectoral programs for the OSYs. Through this executive course, seven project proposals were developed, of which two were implemented during the grant period, which has resulted in the employment of 30-50 OSYs in nearby barangays, and the transition of some OSYs back to formal education (college).

What's Next? Three key pillars were identified to ensure scale-up or sustainability of the innovative project: (1) policy or local ordinance institutionalizing the project as well as LGU-led financing, (2) formal endorsement from the Department of Interior and Local Government and the National Youth Commission, and (3) institutional strengthening via formal partnerships with other agencies.







RAMON ABOITIZ FOUNDATION INC. (RAFI)

RAFI's role is to provide the architecture of participation, setting the stage for partnerships, coalitions and project management by working with local government and civil society in bringing about positive change.

Grant Objectives: Conduct *DigiKabataan para sa Kabuhayan* (Out-of-School Youth Bootcamp) to promote inclusion and empowerment of 30 OSYs by leveraging their digital skills and strengths, enabling them to make meaningful contributions to the success of local micro-entrepreneurs and businesses.

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Grant Highlight: The inter-unit collaboration of RAFI Micro Finance and the RAFI Center for Leaders provided micro-finance services to underprivileged entrepreneurs and also promoted youth development which showcased the team's innovation in designing and delivering training relevant to the needs of the OSY.

As such, the grant project made great impact to the lives OSY in terms of personal learning and development and also expanded their opportunities in community engagement and involvement.

What's Next? Post-program support will be provided to the participants through start-up capital and access to youth engagements aligned with their current needs. The project will also be endorsed to RAFI's program teams by which its outcomes align to their operational strategy.



SCHOOL OF KNOWLEDGE FOR INDUSTRIAL LABOR, LEADERSHIP AND SERVICE (SKILLS) INC.

About the Grantee: SKILLS is a Cebu-based technical vocational institute founded by the Primary Group of Builders in 2008. SKILLS is committed to the training and certification of globally competent Filipino workers. SKILLS carries out its mission through its Senior High School Academic and Technical Vocational Education and Training programs. These programs solve skills shortage, address academe-industry mismatch, and alleviate poverty. SKILLS offers courses in construction, maritime, health, and hospitality.

Grant Objectives:

- 1. Phase 1 target is to train 125 OSY, wherein at least 100 of them must complete the Work Ready Now modules, complete a TVET course, be TESDA-certified, and receive accompaniment support for employment.
- 2. Phase 2 target is to train 133 OSY, wherein 80% of target trainees must complete the training with at least 70% of completers transition to employment, self-employment, or higher level education or training.

Grant Highlight: SKILLS offered demand-driven courses with immediate employment opportunities upon training completion. 77 OSY training completers have already transitioned to jobs, businesses, or higher-level training.

SKILLS developed digital contents of the TVET and WRN courses so that OSY can self-learn through the learning management system, www.skills-ph.com. SKILLS integrated a team building and personal improvement activity to improve retention and build camaraderie. Although SKILLS rolled out construction courses, its approach is inclusive and welcomed women and members of the LGBTQ community.

What's Next? SKILLS will implement Phase 2 of its grant project focusing on the courses: Plumbing NC II, Electrical Installation and Maintenance NC II, and Shielded Metal Arc Welding NC II. Moreover, SKILLS will also rollout the WRN curriculum to more OSYs.

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

Some OSYs who completed their training were able to join Government Internship Program through DOLE using their skills while some were able to enroll at USTP as college students.

What's Next? For USTP to continue to provide and pursue projects and programs for the youth, we will continue to seek partnership and join activities to update us with the latest developments.

What's Next? To Monitor, evaluate, and deploy interns for the maintenance of the system, including feature upgrades and security patches.

YLP is a non-stock, non-partisan youth development organization that upholds and promotes the ideals and values of transformational leadership. Our mission is to engage young leaders, build their capacity to become transformation leaders, and empower them to impact communities.

Grant Objectives: Through USAID Opportunity 2.0 grants, YLP aimed to:

- 1. Directly engage out-of-school youths by raising their awareness, enabling their capacities, and empowering them to impact their communities as problem solvers through the Barangay Youth Catalyst Projects they will implement
- Provide OSYs with quality education and learning experiences, inspire life-long-learning, and lead to an improved education, livelihood, or employment opportunities.

Grant Highlight: The grant projects has reached 209 OSYs and helped 104 transition to new jobs, enterprises, or further studies. Group dynamics were given importance and are presented in a unique and engaging way, ensuring that the youth partners are learning while having fun. Point system (merits and demerits) has been implemented to encourage healthy competition and serve as repercussions to their actions and active participation.

What's Next? YLP will organize the alumni, and they will make a small organization so that their voices will be heard in the right places and a proper quorum. It can be a long-term goal of this organization if they will be recognized as an existing youth organization to the City Youth Development Council.

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Grant Highlight: 25 OSYs who completed training and post-training intervention is now a well-recognized youth organization in Zamboanga City and an active member of the Local Youth Development Council. They are being capacitated further as youth advocates of the Population Commission's campaign on family planning and health. The OSY organization has now grown to four chapters in four barangays in the city, with employed 8 of the 25 employed, 10 continued to further education, and some are self-employed.

What's Next? ZABIDA will be engaged in strategic planning and make a manual of operations with a sustainability plans. Strengthening networking with the local youth council, other local actors, and with the Youth Development Alliance.
