
USAID OPPORTUNITY 2.0 PROGRAM

Second Chance Opportunities for Out-of-School Youth



USAID Opportunity 2.0 is a P1.9-billion (\$37.5 million) program designed to support existing programs and mechanisms for Filipino OSY that improve their education, employment, and livelihood outcomes by 2025.

The five-year program is implemented by U.S.-based Education Development Center in collaboration with DepEd and TESDA and in partnership with Accenture, Philippine Business for Education, Catholic Relief Services, Voluntary Services Overseas, and SEAMEO INNOTECH.





Progress so far (March 2022)

3,293 ers and trainers trained

Self-directed modules have been developed with DepEd and TESDA. ALS implementers and TESDA trainers have also been trained to deliver new content in flexible and engaging ways.

821 OSY have completed TESDA courses with Of those assessed, a remarkable 93 percent is certified by TESDA-a certification rate at par with the national average-proving that youth can excel using blended approaches in learning and even under challenging situations.

743 Employers have been engaged The private sector is engaged to facilitate upskilled youth to new jobs, further training, or additional support in business start-ups as mentors, speakers, or work immersion hosts.

200 support OSY Youth Development Alliances has been established in 12 cities with members trained on Positive Youth Development, equipped with tools enabling them to craft and implement plans and program with and for the vulnerable youth.
