






## USAID OPPORTUNITY 2.0 PROGRAM

Second Chance Opportunities for Out-of-School Youth



USAID Opportunity 2.0 is a P1.9-billion (\$37.5 million) program designed to support existing programs and mechanisms for Filipino OSY that improve their education, employment, and livelihood outcomes by 2025.

The five-year program is implemented by U.S.-based Education Development Center in collaboration with DepEd and TESDA and in partnership with Accenture, Philippine Business for Education, Catholic Relief Services, Voluntary Services Overseas, and SEAMEO INNOTECH.

O2 has engaged youth coming different streams of initiatives such as the Alternative Learning System (ALS), TESDA Online Program (TOP), and Local Service Providers. 25,500 OSY have also been mobilized in youth volunteerism.

5,200 Teachers and trainers trained Ensuring quality education means equipping teachers and trainers with youth-centered methods and content that set learners up for success. O2 has introduced work and business readiness content enhancing the ALS and TVET curricula in the country.



The private sector is engaged to facilitate upskilled youth to new jobs, further training, or additional support in business start-ups as mentors, speakers, or work immersion hosts.

880 Youth Development Alliance members capacitated to support OSY Youth Development Alliances has been established in 15 cities with members trained on Positive Youth Development, equipped with tools enabling them to craft and implement plans and program with and for the vulnerable youth.
